

# Lesson 1 – Building a Tomato Tree

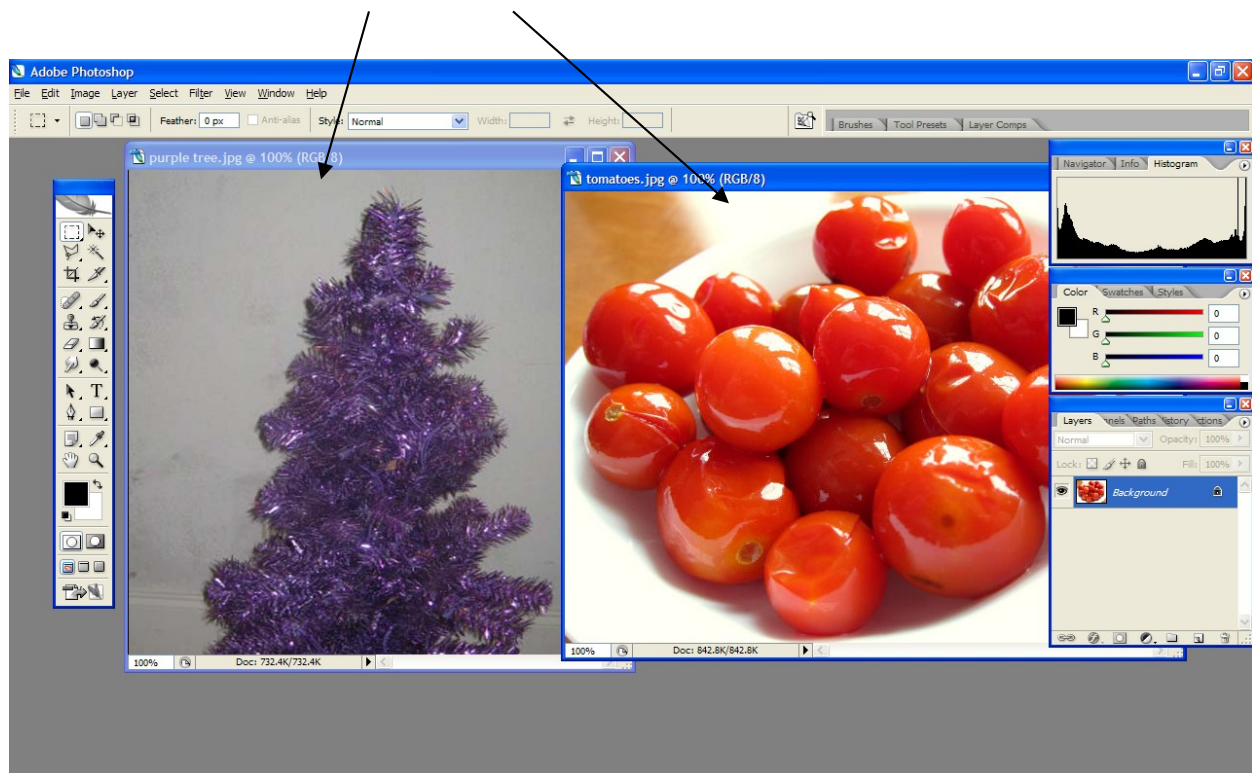
## Moving Selections

1. Go to Start>Programs>Adobe Photoshop CS2, CS3, or CS4
2. Go to File>Open and navigate to Lesson 1-Pictures Folder and open the purple tree picture.
3. Go to File>Open and navigate to Lesson 1-Pictures Folder and open the tomatoes picture.

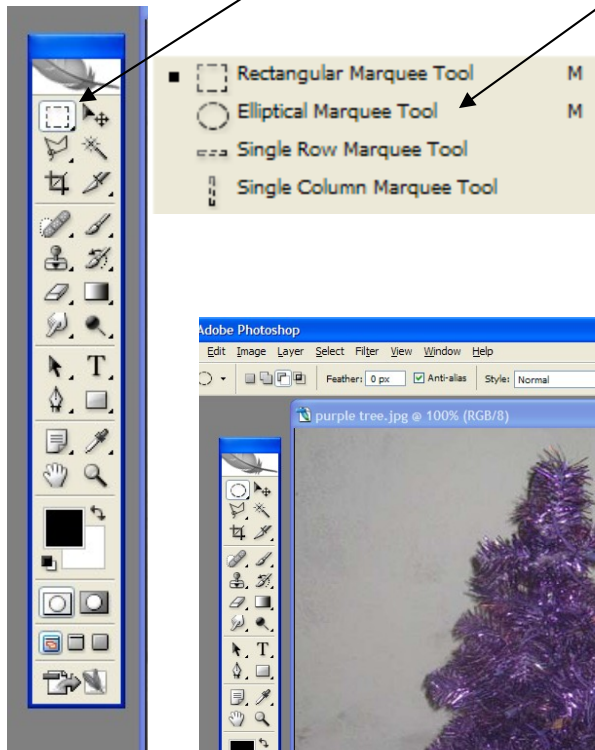


4. Click the Black Arrow (Move Tool) and drag the “tomatoes” picture over so it doesn’t block the other “Purple Tree” picture.

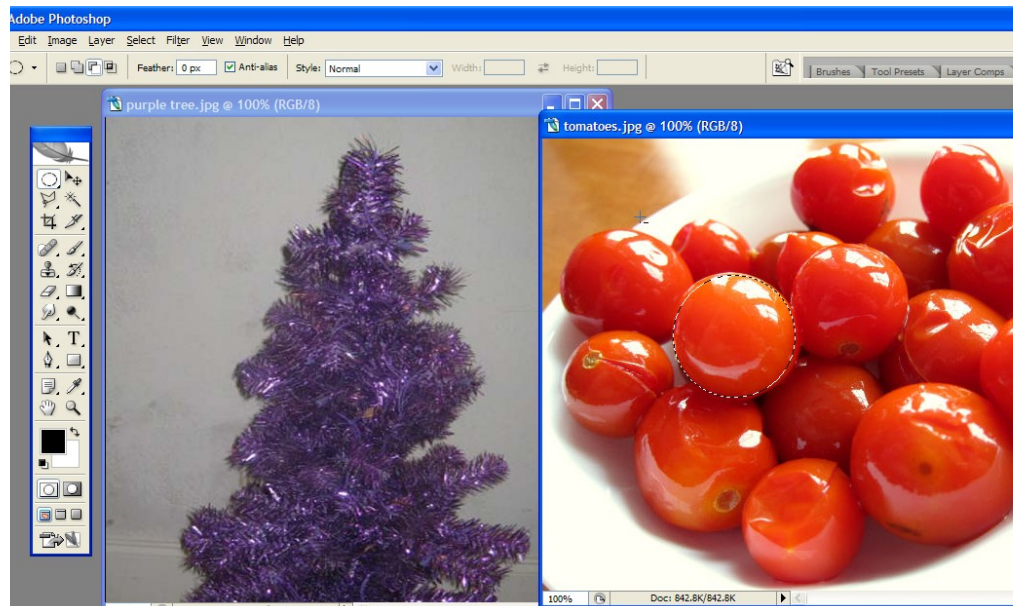
5. Move them so they are side by side.



5. Click your Elliptical Marquee Tool. If it is a rectangle, click and hold until the pull down menu appears.



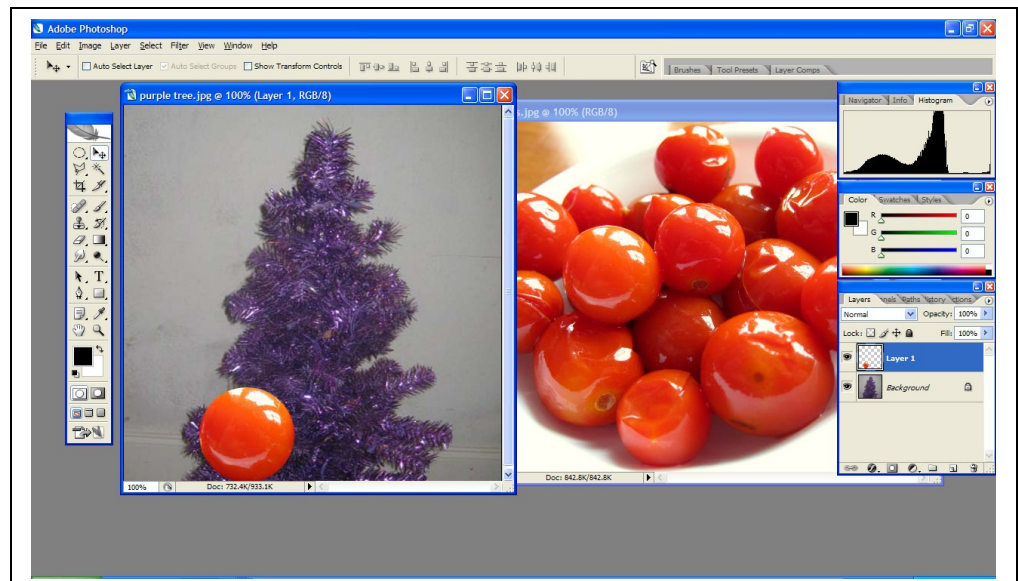
Hold down your Shift and draw circle around a tomato. If you make a mistake, do Ctrl D and try again. Use your arrow to “nudge” the circle around the tomato.



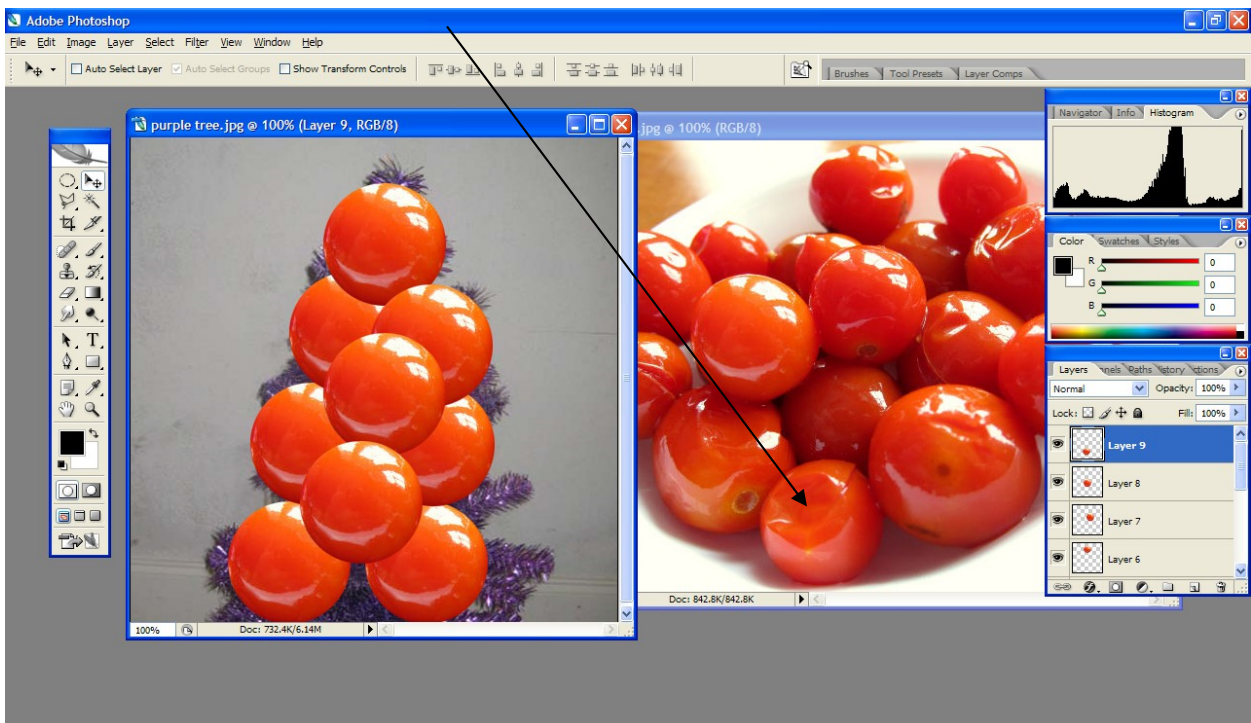
6. Click your Move Tool.



Drag the tomato to the tree. You may have to click to make it stay.



7. Keep your cursor on the tomato and hold down Ctrl and hit “T” on the keyboard to select the tomato. Now you can resize the tomato. Hit Enter when you are done.
8. Go back to your tomatoes and circle another tomato and drag it to the tree.
9. Continue to Drag tomatoes to the tree until you have it covered with tomatoes. You will have to do a Ctrl T to resize them. Check and see what layer they are on.



10. Turn off the “eye” on the background layer. Save as: tomato tree
